SUBMISSION OF NAMES/LIST OF LGBTQ TEACHERS, PRINCIPALS/SCHOOL HEADS INCLUDING NONTEACHING STAFFS

- 1. The Office hereby informs the field on the conduct of the three-day seminar workshop on "Teaching Tolerance: The Responsibility and Accountability Roles of LGBTQ (Lesbians, Gays, Bisexuals, Transgender & Queers) Teachers/Principals in a Challenging Gender-Expansive-Diverse Classrooms" on the first week of September 2017. The exact dates will be announced later once the complete names of the participants will be finalized by the L & D Section.
- 2. In order to expedite the logistical needs of this training, Public Schools District Supervisors (PSDSs) are directed to submit the names of all gay teachers/schools heads (nonteaching staffs may be included) in the district on or before August 17, 2017 (Friday). If there are teachers/staffs in the district whose gender or sexual identity, sexual orientation or gender expressions are still confusing or they (teachers) prefer to be discreet in their gender preferences, orientation or identify, their names can be included in the listing without any label or identification. PSDSs are directed to put in the heading: "Participants of the 2017 LGBTQ Teaching Tolerance Training." Lesbians, bisexuals, transgender and the queers (if there are/is any) should be encoded in a separate listing or file if possible.

- 3. The L&D Section is not creating a stereotypic behavior of insult or discrimination for the LGBTQ community/staffs but the intention is to provide positive behavioral support and intervention as well as inculcate the value of high respect and importance to these group/s of teachers/personnel whose sexual/gender orientations do not fit into the binary choice/s of being a man/woman. This training is further intended to help educators think beyond the gender binary culture and create gender-inclusive classrooms. This seminar will examine thought-provoking case studies and explore best practices in dealing with gay/LGBT teacher-issues and concerns. For educators, this understanding is a critical first step toward changing school-based practices and toward being advocates for all students and stakeholders—regardless of where they fit on any gender spectrum.
