### 2017 PRIDE-PLACES Training Program (3<sup>RD</sup> BATCH)

- 1. This Office hereby announces the conduct of the 2017 Seminar-Workshop on Promoting Respect, Integrity, Discipline and Excellence (PRIDE) by Preventing LARDOs (Learners at Risk of Dropping Out) And Creating Emotional Safety in Schools (PLACES-3<sup>RD</sup> Batch) on November 16-18, 2017 (Thur-Sat) at DepEd Ecotech Center, with the partner service provider, Golden Peak Hotel, Escario St., corner Gorordo Avenue, Cebu City. Please see attached updated training matrix for further details of this learning event.
- 2. The training starts on Thursday (November 16<sup>th</sup>) and ends on Saturday (November 18<sup>th</sup>). Registration is at 6:00AM-7:30AM and the Opening Program will start at exactly 7:45AM. Participants are directed to come on time. The first meal/snack will be served at around 9:00AM on the first day/Day 1. Public Schools District Supervisors are directed to give an endorsement/letter to the participants for their participation on this learning event. The names of the participants may be consolidated and endorsed by school/s district.
- 3. The 2017 PRIDE-PLACES Training Program is an initiative of the Division that generally aims the following:
- 3.1 To provide professional development, to increase the capacity of guidance counselors and teachers in preventing learners who are at-risk of dropping out (LARDOs) and providing positive intervention and support to those learners who are in difficult circumstances, and also giving them the necessary skills in handling students/pupils who demonstrated negative behaviors in schools;
- 3.2 To help improve working environments for staffs/teachers and members of the school community by creating a welcoming and safe learning environment in all schools, an environment that is structured, predictable, mutually respectful of all students and staffs, and free of any harmful activity or comment (emotional safety in schools).
- 3.3 To reiterate/reemphasize the importance of character/values education to the students, despite the diversity and individual differences (of learners) in every classroom,

teachers need to identify and teach the **basic shared values** in a pluralistic society. (Pluralism is not possible without agreement on the values such as respect, integrity, discipline, excellence, honesty, responsibility, courage, self-control, etc. The relevant issue is never on the question: "Should schools teach values?" but rather teachers should ask: "Which values will they teach?" and "How well will they teach them?")

- 4. Participants for the third batch are the designated guidance counselors and master teachers with advisory classes (grade level teacher-leader if no MT in the school may attend) from the 160 elementary schools from the  $1^{ST}$  and  $2^{ND}$  Congressional Districts (except Oslob and Samboan, will join the  $4^{th}$  batch) of Cebu Province. There should be only two participants from each elementary school (160 x 2), a total of 320 participants for the third batch. Please see the attached list of participating elementary schools.
- 5. Participants' identification cards must also be presented during the registration on the first day of this training. A Certificate of Participation will be given to the participants with the indicated 24 training hours earned, however, if the participant is tardy or will not stay during the entire conduct of this learning event (e.g., loafing to the Division Office), the number of hours lost will be deducted from the 24 training hours/credit units. If the participant misses eight (8) hours or more of the training time, only the Certificate of Appearance will be given by the training management.
- 6. Participants, speakers/lecturers and members of the training management will be given service credits and/or Compensatory Time-Off/leave credits whatever is applicable in accordance to existing Civil Service or DepEd issuances or guidelines for the services rendered on a Saturday/November 18<sup>th</sup>.
- 7. This Memorandum serves as Travel Authority of the participants, trainers, admin/logistics/technical training support staffs as well as the other members of the training team/management. - 8. Travelling expenses of the participants shall be charged to the schools' MOOE while (travelling) expenses of the trainers/speakers/EPSs' shall be charged to the Division's MOOE. Expenses for the food or meals/snacks, lodging accommodations (live-in/stay-in arrangement), materials given to the participants/trainers (if there are any) and other related/incidental costs for this training shall be charged to the Division's HRTD/GAD Funds, subject to its availability as well as the usual accounting and auditing rules or regulations.
